

COMMAND SERGEANT MAJOR SEAN P. CARNEY

404th Maneuver Enhancement Brigade Command Sergeant Major

Command Sergeant Major Sean P. Carney assumed duties as the 404th Maneuver Enhancement Brigade in January 2015. His previous assignments were the 766th Brigade Engineer Battalion and the 766th Engineer Battalion Command Sergeants Major, both in Decatur, Illinois from June 2012 to January 2015 and, as the 634th Brigade Support Battalion Command Sergeant Major in Sullivan, Illinois from November 2007 to May 2012.

CSM Carney enlisted in the Army in November 1987 as a Cavalry Scout. He completed OSUT in Fort Knox, Kentucky. He was assigned to HHC 2/41 Infantry Battalion, 2nd Armor Division in Fort Hood, Texas.

CSM Carney transitioned to the Illinois Army National Guard in November 1989. He was assigned to E Troop 106th Cavalry in Streator, IL. He served as a Scout, Section Sergeant, and Platoon Sergeant. The unit transformed to the 202nd Air Defense Artillery in 1995 where he served as Platoon Sergeant, Detachment Sergeant, and First Sergeant.

CSM Carney has deployed twice in support of combat operations including Operation Iraqi Freedom II in 2004 and Operation Enduring Freedom in 2009.

CSM Carneys' professional education includes a Bachelor of Science degree in industrial education and technology from Western Illinois University in Macomb, Illinois. CSM Carney graduated from multiple military courses including the United States Army Sergeants Major Academy; Advanced Noncommissioned Officer course; Basic Noncommissioned Officer Course and Primary Leadership Development Course.
